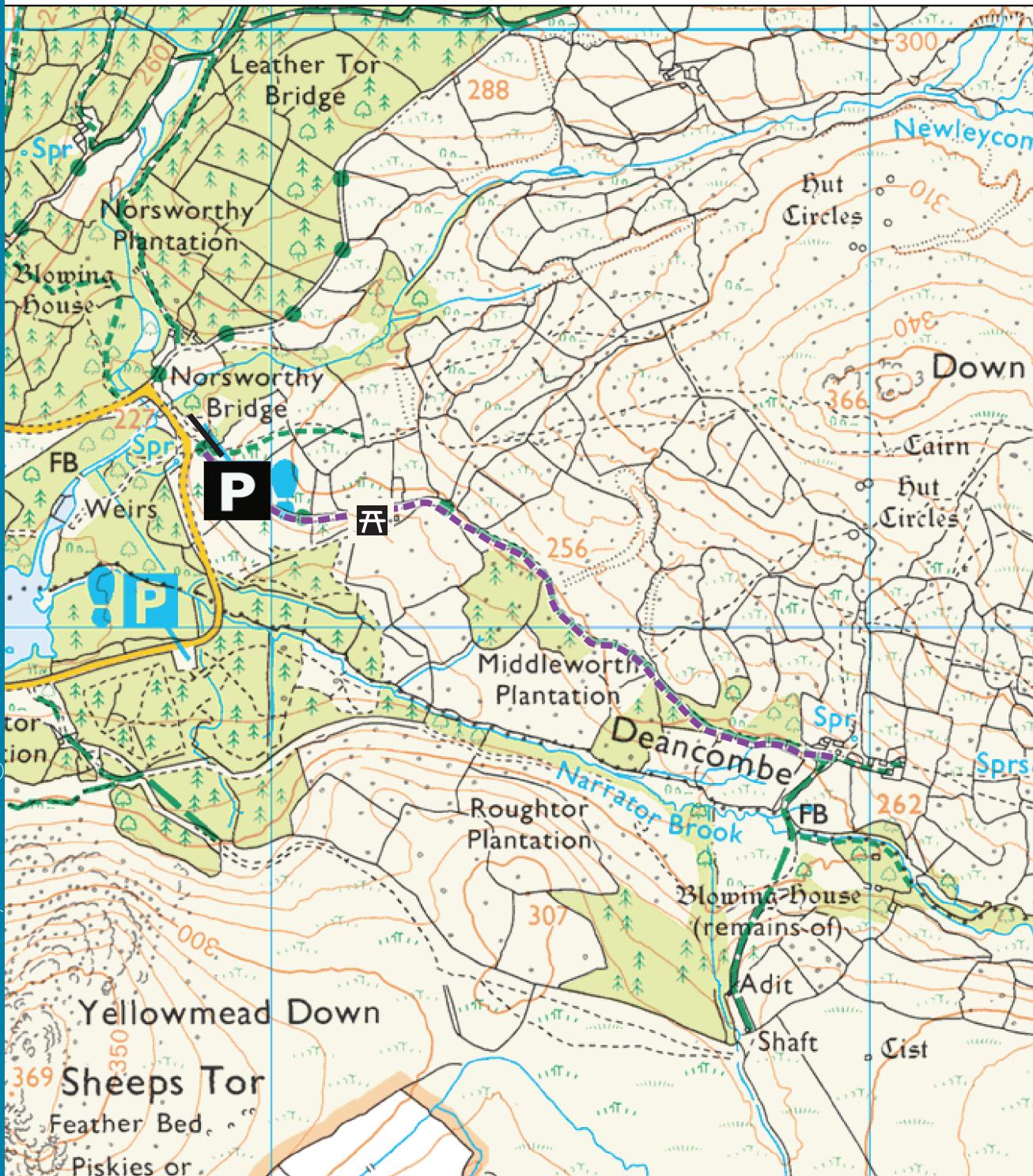




Miles Without Stiles

Norsworthy Bridge Route



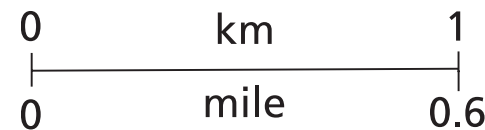
Key

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A self-guided walk taking in the sights and sounds from Norsworthy Bridge to Deanscombe. With a perfect picnic spot along the way.

Please be aware of your own limitations and navigational abilities before embarking on any of our Miles Without Stiles routes.



ROUTE INFORMATION

Parking - : Norsworthy Bridge car park (northeast corner of Burrator Reservoir

Facilities - Public toilet with disabled facilities at Burrator Dam and Discovery Centre

Time - 10 minutes to picnic table, 1.5 hours to get to Deancombe and back

Character - Wide, gravel path but with some slopes. bridge.

Follow the old track leading out of the carpark. This was once used to access the (now derelict) farmstead of Deancombe higher up the valley.

This scenic route offers two options for you to enjoy. The shorter 10-minute walk will take you to a picnic area with an accessible bench or if you are feeling more adventurous continue following the route to Deancombe and back for a nice 2.5km walk.

As you head along the route there are lovely views to enjoy down into the Narrator Brook Valley.



Initially, when setting off from the car park there is a bit of a climb, but the route soon levels out and reaches a wide grassy area. This spot is perfect for stopping for a picnic where you will also find an accessible picnic table.

Continuing along the route to Deanscombe you can enjoy the beauty of some wonderful old beech and oak trees along the way.
