




Brent Island Walk

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A self -guided walk exploring South Brent Island. The suggested walking route will help you experience the delights of the island. A beautiful and quiet place to visit.

Please be aware of your own limitations and navigational abilities before embarking on any of our Miles Without Stiles routes.

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ROUTE INFORMATION

Parking - There is a designated disabled parking bay outside the Coop in Church Street. More public car parking in village.

Facilities - Toilets next to Coop car park
Distance - 1 km max.
Time - 1 hour approx.
Character - Village, trees, river,
meadow. Historic leat and stone
bridge.

Brent Island is a beautiful area surrounded by the river Avon and close to the centre of South Brent.

A lovely spot created for protecting wildlife and for people to enjoy.

This pleasant route follows a tarmac lane (on the south side of the church) down to a wide gravel path leading onto
Brent Island.

The path initially follows a leat and an old stone bridge takes you out of the trees

onto the sheltered meadow of the river island.


This is a wonderful flat grassy area and a great place for a picnic!



There is a stone shelter, the old linhay, at the southern end of the island. The linhay was renovated in 1997 and contains display boards providing information about the island and is very handy for

sheltering when the weather is rainy or too hot.
