

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Self-guided walk exploring Yarner Wood. The suggested walking route will help you experience some of the delights of this lovely part of Dartmoor.

Please be aware of your own limitations and navigational ability before embarking in any of the routes described.

ROUTE INFORMATION

Parking - Yarner Wood Car Park Facilities - There is a public toilet with disabled facilitles at the NNR office. Distance - 2 km Time - 1 hour approx. Character - Sheltered, broadleaved

woodland, stream and pond

This circular route takes you through one of Dartmoor's most important ancient oak woods.

In 1952 it became England's first National Nature Reserve NNR and is particularly well known for its visiting Pied Flycatchers in spring.

The route initially follows a stream valley up out of the car

park along a well-defined gravel path.

After reaching a wooden gazebo it swings up onto slightly higher ground, levels out for a while and then gradually winds its way back to the car park.

Look out for the amazing wood ant nests on the edges of the path.
