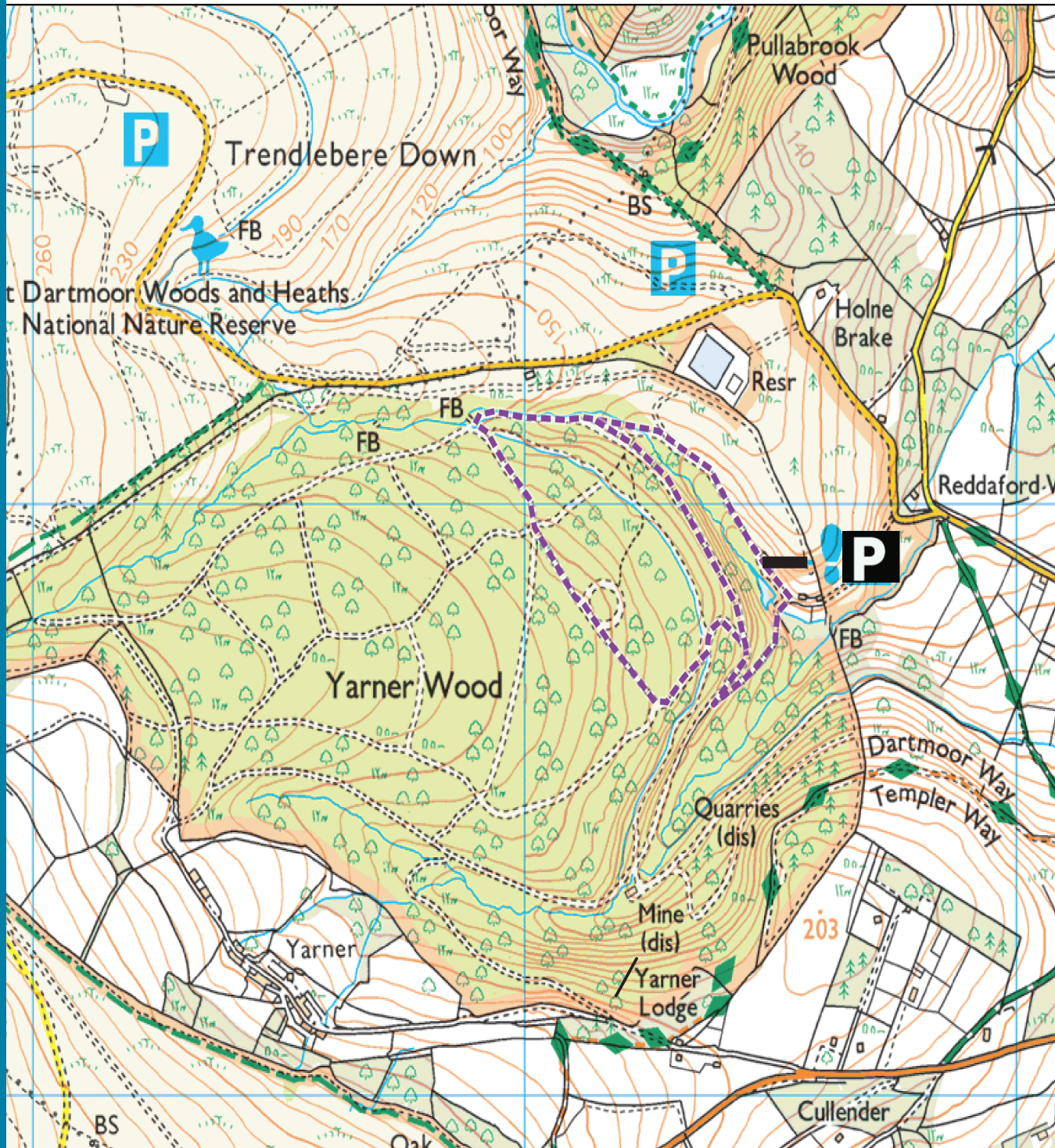

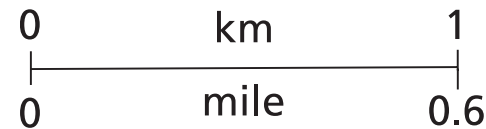

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Self-guided walk exploring Yarner Wood. The suggested walking route will help you experience some of the delights of this lovely part of Dartmoor.

Please be aware of your own limitations and navigational ability before embarking in any of the routes described.

ROUTE INFORMATION

Parking - Yarner Wood Car Park
Facilities - There is a public toilet with disabled facilities at the NNR office.

Distance - 2 km

Time - 1 hour approx.

Character - Sheltered, broadleaved woodland, stream and pond

This circular route takes you through one of Dartmoor's most important ancient oak woods.

In 1952 it became England's first National Nature Reserve NNR and is particularly well known for its visiting Pied Flycatchers in spring.
