

Settlement Profile:

Postbridge

September 2019

This settlement profile has been prepared by Dartmoor National Park Authority to provide an overview of key information and issues for the settlement. It has been prepared in consultation with Parish/Town Councils and will be updated as necessary.



Introduction

Postbridge lies on the road between Two Bridges and Moretonhampstead, 5 miles east of Princetown. It commands a central geographical location within Dartmoor National Park. It is an important destination for visitors to Dartmoor. It hosts a National Park Visitor Centre, a large car park with room for coaches, and is the base for walks into moorland and forest and for viewing the well-known clapper bridge. There is also a youth hostel operating in nearby Bellever.

The village name refers to the pack horse bridge (formed of large dimension clapper stones) over the East Dart River close to the main road. The cottages and inns that grew up around the bridge, along with ancient tenements nearby, came together to form the settlement and community. The turnpike road established in the 1790s, and the granite road bridge that was built in 1792, gave added importance to the settlement.


There is a limited range of local services and facilities. However, there are pubs, a shop and a village hall, and visitor patronage helps support what is currently on offer



Issues Paper Consultation (Dec 2016)

The following summarises issues identified by the Dartmoor Forest Parish Council:

- New development should be concentrated within larger settlements and prioritise brownfield sites
- Concern at impact of high second home ownership and desire to see holiday homes used more often
- Design of forthcoming development should be well insulated and use materials which are durable in the Dartmoor climate
- New housing development should be affordable to local people and meet local need
- Appropriate new uses for redundant historic agricultural buildings should be encouraged, including to accommodate future farming generations
- Affordable housing restrictions should include key workers
- Widening of roads should be considered to improve access


