Introduction

Bittaford lies on the southern flank of Dartmoor, 2 miles east of lvybridge. The village is physically dominated by the railway viaduct, which divides the village into two parts, north and south of the railway line.


There is a modest range of local facilities, but close proximity to Ivybridge means that most household needs can be supplied with relative ease. Ivybridge Station is also nearby.

Bittaford is located within the parish of Ugborough. Part of the parish is inside the National Park and part outside. A parish plan was carried out in 2009 and published in 2010.



Age Profile (Census 2011)




Settlement comparison (Census 2011)

Identifying Housing Need


