THIS ORDER is made by Dartmoor National Park Authority ('the Authority') under Section 119 of the Highways Act 1980 ('the 1980 Act') because it appears to the Authority that, in the interests of the owners of the land crossed by the footpath described in paragraph 1 of this Order, it is expedient that the line of the footpath should be diverted.

The owners of the land have agreed to defray any compensation which becomes payable in consequence of the coming into force of this Order and pay any expenses which are incurred in bringing the new site of the footpath into a fit condition for use by the public.

Devon County Council, Teignbridge District Council and Natural England have been consulted, as required by Section 120(2) of the 1980 Act.

BY THIS ORDER

- The public right of way over the land situated at Bridford in the County of Devon and shown by a bold continuous line on the Order Map contained in this Order and described in Part 1 of the Schedule to this Order shall be extinguished after 28 days from the date of confirmation of this Order, or on such date as the Authority certifies that the work required to bring the new site of the footpath into a fit condition for use by the public has been carried out, whichever is the later.
- There shall, at the end of 28 days from the date of confirmation of this Order, be a public footpath over the land situated at Bridford in the County of Devon as described in Part 2 of the Schedule and shown by a bold broken line on the Order Map contained in this Order.
- Where immediately before the date on which the said footpath is diverted in pursuance of this Order there is apparatus in, on, over, along or across it belonging to statutory undertakers for the purpose of their undertakings, the statutory undertakers shall continue to have the same rights in respect of the apparatus as they would have had if this Order had never been made.
- The rights conferred on the public under this Order shall be subject to the limitations and conditions set out in Part 3 of the Schedule hereto.




