Reducing running and maintenance costs and improving resilience from heating failure. <b>Buckland Monachorum</b>	Commemorative Royal Jubilee Inscription to Victorian water trough, Roborough Down. (JDI)	£ 300	£ 650

<b>Dartmoor Forest</b>	New shed to provide secure and safe housing for electrical equipment at Postbridge Village Hall	£ 1,500	£ 6,500

<b>Buckland in the Moor</b>	Phase Three of the cleaning and restoration of the Historic Medieval Rood Screen. This stage includes the restoration of the Grisaille paintings on the east side of the screen. The only other examples of grisaille paintings of this nature are at Bridford and Ashton churches in Devon. Surprisingly no examples exist in any East Anglian churches making them extremely rare in England and of national importance.	£ 3,000	£ 7,000
<b>North Bovey</b>	Provision of a Boardwalk along badly eroded section of footpath between Bovey Bridge and Bovey Castle. While the land is in private ownership public benefit will be secured through a permitted access agreement between owner and PC formalising improved access along path which members of the public have used for decades. (Offer in principle: subject to Planning Permission, Permissive Footpath agreement and RPA negotiations)	£ 4,940 <i>(provisional)</i>	£ 18,040
<b>Widcombe</b>	Restoration of pig-house and creation of a small stock-proof community garden for the community and visitors to enjoy and to include interpretation boards and farming artefacts.	£ £7,186	£ 24,921
<b>Bridford</b>	Provision of hot water facilities to kitchen and cloakrooms at Bridford Village Hall without which the hall would be severely curtailed in its ability to host functions, events and activities thus making it unsustainable and leaving Bridford without a community meeting place.	£ 1,700	£ 3,475
<b>Manaton</b>	Installation of a modern professional standard kitchen to enable the hall to offer new activities such as cake baking, cookery classes, catering for parties and to increase the variety of events offered, and the income associated with this by offering prepared food and drink at events, increasing foot fall and providing additional income.	£ 2,934	£ 16,534
