

## ROUTE INFORMATION

Parking - Princetown car park behind National Park Visitor Centre Facilities - Disabled public toilets at National Park Visitor Centre Distance - 8 km / 5 miles

**Time** - 1.5 hours approx.

**Character** - Moorland environment with wide, open views.

Please Note - Due to the open nature and altitude of this route it is very exposed and can be cold and windy.

This route takes you to Nun's Cross and back via South Hessary Tor. Follow the public bridleway which starts behind The Plume of Feathers pub.

The open, windswept upland moors are characterised by large expanses of grass and heather, peat blanket bogs, and valley mires. These

provide habitats for wildlife such as skylark, meadow pipit, common lizards and fox moth caterpillars. and he d es of egs, On lan brid re

The open moorland resulted from a long history of human management and diversity is maintained by cattle, pony and sheep grazing. On clear days in the distance you can see Plymouth Sound.



Once you have absorbed the landscapes, head back down the bridleway and into Princetown for refreshments.

An alternative route back is to branch off the bridleway to Peat Cot car park (at grid reference SX 602598) and return to Princetown via the surfaced road through Tor Royal.


